Our vision is to make sure that all deaf children have access to a rich, deaf friendly, language environment, which includes taught sign language in school classrooms around NZ.

The Merge launch was a success with over 70 guests attending on Friday, 7th April 2017. Launching Merge's logos, branding and website (the cake!), were important first steps in the journey to establish this new service.
