What is Auckland Parents of Deaf Children (APODC)?

APODC is an organisation for parents who have a child diagnosed as deaf or hearing impaired. The child's hearing loss may be mild or severe and their ages range from babies to secondary school students. The child may use hearing aids, cochlear implants, bone assisted hearing aids or may communicate through New Zealand Sign Language (NZSL).

Our main focus is to help families. Most deaf and hearing impaired children are born into hearing families who have no experience of what it's like to grow up deaf or hearing impaired. There may be challenges in learning to use an assistive device, such as a hearing aid, or learning to communicate using NZSL. Some families may be reeling from the shock that their baby or child does not hear well. They may have a lot of questions about what the child's future holds...

What we know is that every family is different in how they deal with their situation. We also know that getting together with other families builds strong resources to help your child get the best start in life. There are even research studies that back up what we already know – when families connect, it helps. A group of volunteer parents who have deaf and hearing impaired children run our organisation, so they have first hand experience.

Hi my name's Rachael, I'm married to Colin and we have three children: Effie(5), Freddie(3), Ginny(2). We live in a very busy house in Manurewa with our three children, one dog, two cats and one bantam chicken.

Effie is a success story of the newborn screening programme as she was picked up with mild hearing loss in her left ear at birth. Over the next three years her hearing deteriorated in both ears and at $_3 \frac{1}{2}$ she was profoundly deaf in her left ear, severely deaf in her right ear and suspected ANSD. She is now the proud owner of two awesome cochlear implants, which she loves to decorate up and show off in any manner she can.

As a family we have been learning NZSL through the First Signs programme at home and now that Effie is at school she is taking her signing further and the other students in her class are also getting the opportunity to learn a wee bit of sign!

We have joined APODC as we feel it is important for Effie to have positive deaf role models in her world, and we are keen as a family to be more involved in events that all our kids can come along to and enjoy.
