## Name:Debra BellonRole:Committee Member

#### Hello everyone,

My name is Debra and I am the mother of two children, an 8-year-old boy named Noé (which is the French version of Noah, in case you were wondering), and a 6-year-old profoundly deaf girl named Lucia (pronounced like Lucy with an 'a' on the end). We moved to New Zealand a little over a year ago so that my husband Gilles could take up a lecturer position at the University of Auckland, where he studies climate science (I asked to move to a tropical island -- we got the island part right, I suppose!)

Before that, we lived in various parts of the world, including southwestern France, Manhattan, southern India, and California, where I am originally from. I have been learning various sign languages since I was a teenager and am now thoroughly confused, but I am trying to learn NZSL with the help of KDEC's parent education classes and very patient Deaf New Zealanders. I currently work as Communications Coordinator at the Spark Centre of Creative Development, which is an art centre for people with disabilities, and my background (read: what I did before I had kids) is in writing and filmmaking.

Lucia is a student at the KDEC satellite unit at Kelston Primary School, which she loves, and Noé attends the French bilingual unit at Richmond Road School, so my second job is taxi driver (I even drive a white Toyota Prius). Lucia has additional needs in addition to her hearing loss, so we have tried just about every form of therapy and communication out there. She has bilateral cochlear implants and communications with a mix of spoken language, sign, and pictures. I have a particular interest in cultivating relationships between families of deaf children and Deaf adults. I look forward to helping to plan and coordinate activities as part of the APODC committee.
