EXCELLENCE AWARDS 2020 OPEN NOW

Do you know a Deaf or Hard of Hearing student in Year 1 - Year 8 who deserves recognition either academically, or as part of the social environment within education?

- The DCNZ Excellence Awards acknowledge the effort and achievement of a Deaf or Hard of Hearing (D/HH) student, in their school or education setting
- Applicants can be nominated by anyone eg via a referral letter from a teacher, or other education professional
- DCNZ provides certificates and medals for students in Years 1 8
- The Norma Taylor Memorial Trophy is also awarded for a student who has consistently achieved recognition within their school over five years at secondary level
- The Paton Family Trophy is awarded for Excellence in sport
- DCNZ encourages schools to present the Excellence Awards during an assembly or prize giving ceremony, alongside peers, families and whānau

Zoom Well-being session for adults - To be confirmed soon

We have all been dealing with new anxieties and pressures this year, which often feed tensions at home, and at school. We are looking at running a Zoom session for caregivers, where you will be introduced to some strategies to implement at home, focusing on family well-being, so that you can build your existing tool kit.

Some of the things that we thought might be helpful at this time are:

- 1) Self-awareness and self-care
- 2) Conflict resolution
- 3) Relaxation
- 4) Shifting perspective; bring emotions into check when things start to spiral
- 5) Dealing with change building a coping toolbox

We are making enquiries with facilitators to run this session, and will be able to confirm the date and time soon.
