

Proposed Remit to the APODC Constitution concerning frequency of Committee Meetings

#### Current clause:

14.1 The Managing Committee meetings shall be held monthly, or as often as they determine, and may be called together by the President, or 3 Officers and/or Managing Committee Members, upon giving notice to the Secretary.

### Amended clause:

14.1 The Managing Committee will hold a minimum of 8 Managing Committee Meetings a year, at regular intervals.

### **National Survey of Children's Audiology Services**

Ko Taku Reo have commissioned a review of their Audiology service, which is being run by Dr Andy Phillips, Chief Allied Health Professions Office at Hawkes Bay DHB. Andy is an experienced Audiologist and has undertaken Audiology reviews in both the UK and New Zealand.

Andy has designed a survey for parents and Ko Taku Reo would like as many parents as possible to complete it so they can gather information on their experiences of Audiology services throughout the country. This will assist in developing Ko Taku Reo's Audiology service and how staff can better work in with other Audiology services that Deaf and Hard of Hearing young people are involved with.

The survey is for parents of all Deaf and Hard of Hearing parents regardless of whether they access Ko Taku Reo's Audiology service or DBH Audiology services. They are very keen to hear from all parents as that will give them a good understanding of a variety of children's Audiology nationally.
