

### **MERGE - NZSL course in Waipu**



Join and learn New Zealand Sign Language (NZSL) course in Mangawhai!

NZSL is a beautiful language, and an official language of NZ. This is a NZSL Beg 1a course -suitable for students with no previous experience with NZSL. The course will be delivered through blended learning. In this arrangement, you will attend onsite classes with other participants, and the teacher will teach virtually with an onsite facilitator to support your learning. Certificate of Attendance and will be issued at the end of the course.

### **Research Opportunites**



This is a research opportunity for 6 to 9 year old English speaking children. This includes children with hearing aids and children with typical hearing.

If you are interested or want to ask some questions, please email Caelyn (<u>caelyn.eades@pg.canterbury.ac.nz</u>). Alternatively, <u>click here</u> to ask questions and/or provide alternative contact details.

**Where**? Caelyn is due to visit **Auckland in early June**. Please email her directly to confirm dates and locations.

**Who can do it?** 6.5- to 9-year-old English-speaking children (at least 80% of the time). This includes children with hearing aids and children with typical hearing.

**What's involved?** It will be 1- to 1.5 hours. Children will do word/picture puzzles and story-telling tasks. A parent or guardian will need to fill out a questionnaire.

**What benefits are there?** You will also get a summary of your child's language skills. You/your child may also feel good about completing interesting activities and helping us learn more about children's language use.

Participating families will also receive a koha (thank you gift). The koha will include a \$30 voucher, a certificate, and a book

This study has ethics approval by the Health and Disability Ethics Committee (HDEC). The reference number is 2024 FULL 19267.



This is a research opportunity for parents/guardians of Pacific children/adolescents who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing.

Where? Linda will conduct interviews over the phone or on Zoom at a time that is suitable for you.

Who can do it? Parents or guardians of Pacific children or adolescents who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing.

What's involved? An interview of approximately 1 hour, based on your experiences as a parent of a child or adolescent who is Deaf or Hard of Hearing. These interviews focus on your knowledge, experiences, and challenges you may have faced.

**What benefits are there?** This research focuses on quantifying the lived experience of Pacific families and highlight the role that parental involvement has among Pacific children and adolescents who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing, with a view to improving health services.

Participants will receive a koha in the form of a \$50 gift voucher.

This study has ethics approved by the Auckland Health Research Ethics Committee and data published is confidential. The reference number is AH24689.


