## NZSL Teacher - Rachel Walker

Rachel Walker is a professional Deaf teacher and has been teaching New Zealand Sign Language to adults and children for over 20 years.



#### **Private Lessons**

If you want to learn or develop your NZSL Rachel offers private lessons to families across Auckland. In these lessons you will benefit from 1-on-1 time with a dedicated and experienced teacher in a location of your choice. Prices range between \$40 and \$60 depending on group size.

#### **Funding for NZSL lessons**

Families in New Zealand can apply for government subsidies for New Zealand Sign Language (NZSL) lessons under certain conditions. The availability of subsidies often depends on the specific circumstances, such as whether a family member is Deaf or has hearing loss. Here are some common avenues through which subsidies might be available:

<u>Ministry of Education</u>: Families with Deaf or hard-of-hearing children may be eligible for support from the Ministry of Education. This can include funding for NZSL lessons for both the child and their family members to help with communication at home.

<u>Ministry of Health</u>: The Ministry of Health may provide funding for NZSL lessons if a family member is Deaf or has a hearing loss, particularly if it's crucial for effective communication within the family.

<u>Work and Income (WINZ)</u>: In some cases, Work and Income may provide financial assistance for NZSL lessons, especially if learning the language is essential for the family's wellbeing or integration into the community.

ACC (Accident Compensation Corporation): If hearing loss is a result of an accident, ACC may cover the cost of NZSL lessons as part of the rehabilitation process.

<u>Community Grants and Charities</u>: Some community organizations, charities, and local councils may offer grants or subsidies to families wanting to learn NZSL, especially in cases where there is a significant need for language support.

We advise that families contact these organizations or relevant local bodies directly to check eligibility and the application process.
